




Coral Catch - Indonesia's Superwomen Of The Reef 7:37

Hindara Dania is a local girl from Gili Air, Indonesia trying to achieve great things in marine science.


She is driven to change stereotypes in her community through SCUBA diving and coral reef restoration

DIRECTOR: Jaime Jacobsen - USA



Fed by the Mekong River, the Tonlé Sap in Cambodia is home to hundreds of thousands of people living in 'floating villages.' The lake is also the source of 75% of Cambodia's fish (equal to 60% of the country's protein intake). Because of a combination of threats, from pollution to climate change, the densely populated area's fish populations are dwindling – but locals are educating themselves to make positive changes

Over 35 years ago Grupo Ecológico Sierra Gorda (GESG) was founded, led by the singular vision of one woman and her family and their mission to preserve, protect and regenerate the unique biodiversity of the Sierra Gorda. Since their founding, the GESG team has built out integrated community environmental education programs and celebrations to bring joy to the serious work of regeneration and conservation. Their community-led model, backed by science and research, has led to measurable habitat regeneration






A Tortoise Called Pumpkin Spice 10:56

How should humans and nonhuman animals connect?






Broken Souls 11:00

DIRECTOR: Alexa Elliott - USA



A wolf trainer pushes the boundaries of animal medical care by listening and building trust







On the morning of November 25th, in Bandhavgarh's Khitauli Zone, we encountered and filmed the legendary tiger Chota Bheemunaware that it was possibly capturing one of his final appearances. What followed was more than a safari memory—it became a haunting responsibility. The image of Chota Bheem's weary, wounded eyes stayed and became the research of his story and the larger issues of poaching and human-wildlife conflict in India. This was a story that demanded to be told to raise awareness about the fragile state of our forests and the voiceless lives they shelter

Personally endorsed by Jane Goodall, "Ethicall" is a film celebrating a milestone in vegan history. The vegan society was co-founded on November 1st 1944 in Yorkshire, England by woodworker Donald Watson. This initiated the vegan movement: 2024 marks 80 years of veganism. But is that original dream still enough to change the world today? This completely unique and original documentary, which is made from remotely captured videos by vegans around the world (including US, India, Australia) and previously unheard archive footage, explores that very theme in a celebratory way offering contemporary and historical insights from over the years

Expedition to Casiquiare 24:52

DIRECTOR: Diego Bilbaol - Australia

The Casiquiare 2023 expedition was a binational voyage that explored the only river that naturally connects the Orinoco and Amazon basins. The mission of 15 scientists and four journalists aimed to assess the health of river dolphins and other animals, with a view to designating the area as a Ramsar Site, recognizing its international importance for the conservation of its ecosystems and species

Forest Of Colours 52:00

DIRECTOR: Miguel Anton - Thailand



DIRECTOR: Ali Ziani - Germany





Gharials of Chambal 9:38

DIRECTOR: Shivang Mehta - India

Every winter, the Chambal River echoes with the deep, resonant calls of male gharials. Using their unique bulbous snout, the ghara, they send out love songs across the misty waters. If a female tilts her snout upwards, it's a rare and ancient "yes" in the wild.

Once on the brink of extinction with fewer than 200 left in the 1970s, gharials in India have made a slow but powerful comeback. Their final refuge? The National Chambal Sanctuary, spanning across Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, and Rajasthan, is their last remaining home

Ireland's Wild Islands 50:00

DIRECTOR: John Murray, Jamie Fitzpatrick - Ireland

This spectacular new series features the wildlife wonders of Ireland's Atlantic islands, hosted by Irish presenter Eoin Warner. Revealing striking animal behaviour set in magnificent storm ravaged locations, a 140 year old sailboat is Eoin's base as he sails out in search of Ireland's most stunning islands and their wild residents

Irrawaddys of the Chilika Lagoon 6:23

Chilika in Odisha, India, is Asia's largest brackish water lagoon. Tourists are known to line up in the area for a glimpse of Chilika's Irrawaddy dolphins, who surface the lagoon only for a quick breath or a peek at their surroundings. 





Through a blend of breathtaking underwater footage and heartfelt narratives, the documentary highlights the conservation initiatives aimed at protecting majestic species like Manta Rays and Humpback Whales, which are increasingly threatened by human activities and environmental changes

The Eastern Bettong has been extinct on mainland Australia for over a hundred years. This small marsupial was once common and widespread, until European colonisation pushed them to the brink. This short documentary shares a unique insight into the lives of Eastern Bettongs. It tells their story from persecution and local extinction, to their comeback and return thanks to Australian conservation scientists

Zimbabwe. A vast valley. After generations of farming, has seen its natural environment restored. Sentosa is an inspiring tale of love resilience, and transformation, told through the eyes of an islander who has witnessed Pulau Blakang Mati evolve into Sentosa. The film chronicles the island's journey from a quiet haven to a bustling tourism hub, highlighting conservation efforts that preserve its natural beauty. A tribute to Sentosa's rich heritage and its unsung heroes, the film reminds us of the power of community, connection, and the shared responsibility of safeguarding a place where nature and progress coexist in balance

oin the Shamwari Private Game Reserve's renowned conservation team, led by pioneering veterinarian Dr. Johan Joubert and senior ecologist Dr. John O'Brien, as they protect and conserve one of Africa's most remarkable wildlife areas. They rehabilitate and rewild newly acquired land, which includes the capturing and relocation of zebras, elephants, buffalo, rhinos and lions. They also implement cutting-edge AI technology to comat rhino poaching.

DIRECTOR: Joshua Bruni - USA


Lauren Rust and Tracy Kowalcyzk are the only two people responsible for responding to stranded marine mammals along the entire coastline of South Carolina. They conduct a variety of research on the dolphins of South Carolina, such as boat surveys and necropsy's, to further their education and awareness to the public on the human impacts on the dolphins such as boat strikes, entanglements, and harassment

Against the backdrop of the sixth mass extinction, an all-woman team of biologists set out to save bats from a deadly fungal disease, but when the COVID-19 pandemic interrupts their work, they are sent down a path of discovery that illuminates the connections between bat conservation and the spread of infectious disease

The Azores. One of the most remote recently tuna fishermen of one of its smallest islands have had close encounters with a population of large Whale Sharks, completely unknown to science.

Common perceptions and media depictions of the swamp ecosystem usually portray a dark, dank place filled with monsters. It's described as a place of death. Our film acknowledges these negative impressions and aims to dispel them by showcasing some of the area's stunning fauna and unique flora. The film presents factual details of species and habitat, and refutes several false myths, legends and rumors targeting specific species



The Mud Pack 6:10

The Sundarbans mudflats are rife with tiny evolutionary curiosities that come alive with the waning tide — watch a battle in the muck, and the fine seduction of a fiddler crab



The Real Yellowstone 1:27:00

THE REAL YELLOWSTONE reveals the untold story of America's ranching families, who for generations have lived at the intersection of land, livestock, and wildlife. Far from the romanticized television version, this film immerses viewers in the gritty realities of rural life, where families struggle to hold onto their heritage while facing rising costs, shifting policies, predator conflict, and the pull of urban expansion






The Scales of the Forest 52:00

DIRECTOR: Manon Kole, Lucas Perrogon - France


A plant or animal species disappears every 20 minutes worldwide. That's over 26,000 species a year. Far fewer are being discovered, and by cross-referencing information, it seems likely that some species are disappearing before they have even been recorded. In Yasuni National Park, the territory of the Kichwa and Huaorani peoples, the team carried out a biodiversity inventory in the following categories: herpetology and ornithology



The Secret Life Of Plants 52:10

DIRECTOR: Enikő Berta - Hungary

The knowledge of how plants live stops at one point for the average person: They need to be watered, and then they will grow. But plants are not passively vegetative creatures. They record the events of the past, plan for the future, and ruthlessly keep their own interests in mind. They have "cunning tactics" that we are only now beginning to truly discover. And let's face it, who would have thought that the insignificant little bracken fern bush we pass on a spring walk was actually a thousand years old?



Whales in a Plastic Ocean 26:42

DIRECTOR: Alexa Elliott - USA

Far out in the eastern Atlantic, the Portuguese island of Madeira rises from the depths of the open ocean. Despite its remote location, the archipelago is impacted by floating plastic trash. Researchers with MARE-Madeira study the effects plastics, and their chemical compounds, have on the health of marine mammals that frequent local waters
